

**PFOA Update Meeting
Tuesday, May 24, 2016
@ 7:00 pm at Campbell High School**

Pennichuck Corporation ("Pennichuck") has been engaged by Saint-Gobain, at the request of the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services ("NHDES"), to prepare a design of a water main extension that would provide public water to the property owners of Litchfield with private wells that have been impacted or might be impacted by PFOA's. This engagement will be used to determine the cost and feasibility of constructing this extension of the current public water system in the town, which Saint-Gobain will use in their evaluation of the potential expansion of public water, as one of the potential remedial actions being considered by them cooperatively with the NHDES.

The purpose of the meeting is to:

1. Provide an overview of the areas in Litchfield where an extension of public water is being investigated.
2. Provide a timeline for the water main design activity that will take place in your neighborhood.
3. Explain why Pennichuck's engineers will need access to your property and residence, in order to assess the best way to connect your home's existing plumbing to the public water main.
4. Schedule appointments with Pennichuck staff members that will be present at the meeting, for dates and times when the Company's engineering staff can complete the assessment at your home, as detailed in item 3 above.
4. Provide property owners with security information and protocols, detailing how you can confirm that individuals seeking access to your property are actually Pennichuck's engineers.
5. Answer property owner questions regarding the investigation of the extension of public water.
6. Allow the NHDES to update property owners on the status of the PFOA investigation.

In order to provide the best approach to the water main extension design, it is essential that Pennichuck gain access to all the homes that would be connected to public water should an extension of public water occur. To that end, Pennichuck hopes that most or all of the impacted Litchfield private well owners can attend this meeting, so we can expedite this process to the benefit of all.
